Grace and peace to you from God our father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

**Lent:** As we started the journey to the cross, and beyond the cross to Easter, we continue thinking about what it means to renovate our lives as followers of Jesus. We are using Jacob Armstrong's *Renovate: Building a Life with God* to help frame this year's Lenten journey. This is a heart-level series reflecting on the work God can do through us.



**Renovate Small Groups:** As part of this, we have three small groups (Wednesday evening, Sunday morning, and Tuesday afternoon) using the *Renovate* materials.

**New Parent Group:** We also have a new option for parents on Wednesday evenings. Rob and Carrie Gilkerson are leading a group structured so a person can come whenever they are available. Childcare is available in the nursery and school-aged kids can have fun at Awana or Youth Group.

**Wednesday's During Lent:** Our Wednesday evenings are following a similar, yet slightly adjusted, schedule during Lent.

Meal: 5:00-5:55 p.m. (Great Hall)

Worship: 5:55-6:25 p.m. (Sanctuary)

On Wednesday evenings, children are starting in worship, and after the children's moment are spending the remainder of worship time with Tina (Family Ministries) working on a Lenten activity in the Great Hall.

Small Groups: 6:30-7:30 p.m.

In worship we continue to use video messages from the Dakotas Conference United Methodist leadership based on concepts from the *Renovate* series.

**General Conference:** Pastor Jenny and I are receiving questions about the special General Conference that oc-

curred at the end of the February. If you'd like to visit about any of this, we are happy to talk. Give us a call and we can set a time to visit.

There are a number of moving parts as the General Conference decisions are being addressed. The United Methodist Judicial Council will be reviewing the decisions and determining how things will be implemented. At the same time, there are a number of additional conversations taking place exploring the future direction of the church.

**Weather:** We're thankful that it is beginning to look and feel more like spring in our area. Through mid March, it was a tough winter. Through your faithfulness, we have been holding our own regarding attendance and giving. We're looking forward to warming weather with less ice so all who want to be here can make it.



**Worship Recommendations:** We have identified The Consensus Council to help us faithfully work through restructuring and improving our worship vitality. We have embarked into this journey, and are continually retooling how this process unfolds. We continue to build our laity/staff team we will be working with in the upcoming future. If you have any questions, comments, and/or concerns, let's visit. We continue to prepare for a very intentional, deep look at how and where we God is leading us with the worship experiences we offer.

The intent of this process is to strengthen our current witness while continuing to position McCabe for the future.

**Purpose:** Part of this process will be to take a good look at each service, determine the purpose of the service, and determine the intended demographics for each service we offer.

**Services:** Part of this process, too, will likely include some changes to the number of services and times of the services we offer.

**Team Forming:** We have a team that is beginning to form to represent McCabe and lead us into the future. Our team is forming.

Minimal requirements to be on the team include:

- A commitment to attend the meetings
- We anticipate 3 -5 meetings.
- A commitment to pray for the work of the team
- A commitment to not say: I won't change.

A commitment to say: How do we best change our structure and schedule to reach people and to be good stewards of what God has given us.

**Board of Directors:** At our March Board of Directors' meeting, we celebrated the faithful service of 5 people leaving the Board and welcomed 5 new people. We just completed the first year of continuing to live into the streamlined administrative structure process at McCabe that started 5 or 6 years ago. These individuals faithfully served God and served you representing McCabe. Thank you to Mark Benesh (Trustees Chair), Kim Mertz (Board Chair and Finance), Mary Lee Steele (Trustees), Beth Swanson (Staff Parish), and Larry Wood (Trustees) for your faithful service over the years, and especially over this past year as we've lived into this new structure. We look forward to seeing how and where God is leading you next!

New Board members were welcomed at this meeting. In the next month or so, we will formally commission the new Board during a worship service. New Board Members are: Dave Hagler, Chad Monroe, Katie Parker-Riccio, James Reiner, and Annette Willis. Together we look forward to continuing to press into God's presence and joining with the living, moving Spirit to fulfill God's purpose for McCabe. Thank you to each for investing in this ministry!

**Lasting Impact:** Beginning in April, and continuing for the upcoming months, your Board of Directors will be reading the book 'Lasting Impact' by Carey Nieuwhof. If you'd like a copy of this book, I'd be happy to get one for you.

**Open Door Property:** At the time of this writing, there is quite a bit happening around the sale of the McCabe's property on south 12<sup>th</sup> Street (the Open Door property).

**Sanctuary Audio/Visual:** Things are beginning to take shape with our new audio / visual work. We anticipate this work to be done by the end of March. Because of some generous gifts, and wanting to make sure everything was coordi-

nated, this project has taken longer than originally anticipated. In the next couple weeks we anticipate having a new camera, sound board, computers, microphones, etc. We are looking forward to beginning livestreaming and improving our audio/visual in different ways.

We've had some good reminders recently on how livestreaming would be nice to have when weather has prevented people from getting here. We also have people who travel south for parts of the winter who are looking forward to being able to stay connected with McCabe by watching it live, or recorded, online.



As part of this process, we are also working with our projection providers to improve the crispness and clarify of some of the projection we are doing.

**Dakotas Annual Conference:** It's time to begin pulling together our team who will represent McCabe at Annual Conference. If you are interested in visiting about what this means, let me know and let's sit down and have coffee.



**Wednesday Lenten Services Offering:** Going forward, the Wednesday evening Lenten service offerings will be split between a **local** and a **global mission**.

**Locally**, our March One Thing is camping scholarships. Camping can be a life changing experience. The camping brochures are here and registration is open. Keep in mind that *McCabe will pay half of your camping registration up to \$100 per person*. Karen Workman will help with the registration process and Tina Mitchell is a great resource too. We continue to raise money to help offset the costs of camping for individuals attending camp.

**Globally**, the United Methodist Church is often one of the first relief organizations on the ground after a disaster. We (the United Methodist Church) are often on the ground preparing even before a disaster actually hits and the United Methodist Church has a reputation of staying engaged and not abandoning areas after relief efforts are no longer in the news. Part of the way this happens is through UMCOR – The United Methodist Committee on Relief.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> half of our Wednesday evening Lent offering will help fund UMCOR operations.

**Camping:** Our 'One Thing' for March is supporting camping ministries. Camping can be a life changing experience. The camping brochures are here and **registration is open**. Keep in mind that *McCabe will pay half of your camping registration up to \$100 per person*. Karen Workman will help with the registration process and Tina Mitchell is a great resource too.



**Contemporary Service:** Our contemporary (non-traditional) service has comfortably moved back into the Great Hall.

**Celebrate Recovery:** It's an exciting time for Celebrate Recovery. McCabe and The Dakotas Conference have been helping to support this new church plant. Celebrate Recovery currently offers a meal, a worship experience, and a number of small groups on Saturday evening and throughout the week at McCabe. Around the middle of May, Celebrate Recovery anticipates beginning ministry at a different location off site from McCabe.

**Serving the Banquet:** Thursday, April 11 McCabe is scheduled to serve the Banquet. We are asked to bring 30 volunteers. The meal is for the homeless, the elderly, the lonely, the young families with children that struggle to make ends meet, and children that go to bed hungry.

**60 years at our current site:** While the congregation of McCabe has been organized for over 125 years, we have been located at our current site for 60 years.



**Palm Sunday Cantata:** McCabe's choir will be offering their annual Palm Sunday Cantata over the course of the weekend on April 13 (5:00 p.m.) and April 14 (8:00 a.m. and 9:30 a.m.)

### WEDNESDAYS IN LENT:


