Something New for the Students at Will-Moore Elementary School

While visiting with Mr. Brad Barnhardt, Principal of Will-Moore Elementary School, he challenged McCabe Church to try a new program to enhance learning of students at Will-Moore. Kids Hope, U.S.A. is a program which brings mentoring into the local school.

I visited with Pastor Fossum about this program and he agreed this was a fit to the outreach of our church. In October, I attended a two-day training in Naperville, Il. The program is used in thirty-eight states, North Dakota being the thirty-eighth. McCabe Church will be the first church in North Dakota to implement this mentoring program. This is very exciting!

The program consists of three hours of training for mentors, members of our congregation, and the commitment of one hour per week to meet with one child to help that child connect with our mentor. The mentor will go into Will-Moore to meet with the student. The most powerful component is that each mentor and child will have a prayer partner from our congregation. The mentor and prayer partner will communicate as to when the mentoring will take place and the needs of the student. We all know the power of prayer. This is a proven program that changes the lives of students.

The plan is to implement this program in the school's second semester. I need for each of you to think about how you are able to contribute to this life changing opportunity. One hour per week, wrapped in prayer, has the power to save the life of one child at a time.

Thoughts from Justin Balzer

As the Christmas season approaches and we prepare for family celebrations and gatherings, it can be a pretty busy time of year. This year for both youth groups, we are studying the book "A Different Kind of Christmas" by Mike Slaughter. One important lesson from the book is to expect a miracle. Often, at times, we do not believe that the miraculous can happen to us, that it is reserved only for stories that we read about on the internet or in a book. You need to believe that God can make a miracle happen in your life.

Think back to the book of Isaiah, 7:14, which says, *"All right the Lord himself will choose the sign. Look! The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son and call him Immanuel."* Here we have the prophet Isaiah telling us and King Ahaz, that a miracle will happen, a virgin will give birth to the savior. Fast forward around 600 years later and a young girl would be visited by the angel Gabriel and the angel would say, *"Don't be frightened, for God has decided to bless you! You will become pregnant and have a son, and you are to name him Jesus."* Luke 1:30-31.

Mary's initial reaction is reasonable considering the circumstances, Mary asked the angel, *"But how can I have a baby? I am a virgin."* Luke 1:34. Mary didn't understand that such a thing could happen to her, but the angel tells her that with God, nothing is impossible. Mary is comforted and then accepts the role that God has prepared for her, miracles and all. The key for us to expect the miracle, like Mary, is to accept that God can do anything and that anyone, from Mary to each of us, can be used by God for those miracles.

As we move further into December, the youth group is preparing for our bi-annual lock-ins. December 6, will be the lock-in for F.L.Y. (grades 6-9). December 13, will be the lock-in for senior high youth group (grades 9-12). Grade 9 can pick which lock-in they would like to attend. Both lock-ins start at 8:00 p.m. and go until 9:00 a.m. the next morning. There will be movies, games and food provided. We will need some parent volunteers (you do not have to stay up all night!). The list night of youth group will be December 18, this will be the youth group Christmas Party, for all youth group kids, grades 6-12, and it will have an early start time at 6:00 p.m.
