- Plan for the transition. Important welcoming gestures may be missed with everyone thinking someone else is handling these details. Appoint a liaison person to whom the pastor can go for help and information during the transition.
- Welcome the new pastor on moving day. Have a small group greet the new pastor and family when they arrive and help as needed. Stock the parsonage refrigerator and pantry with some staples.
- Provide a map/list of local dry cleaners, grocery stores, drug stores and information on options for internet and cable television providers. Give gift certificates to several favorite restaurants in the community.
- Wear name tags. Even if name tags are not a tradition, the congregation can wear them for a few weeks to help the pastor learn names.

I pray that God will continue to bless this wonderful and faithful church. You will be in my thoughts and prayers . . . always.

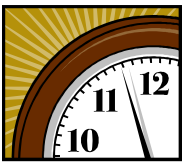
## McCabe Prayer Vigil

## Wholly Healthy

Greetings McCabe friends,  
What is that strange object in the sky? The bright rays and amazing light make me feel better and warm all over. Actually, it makes me feel almost hot! Shh, don't speak it aloud but is that sunshine we see? Is it really spring approaching summer?! FINALLY!!!

With summer coming our way I want to again remind you of the importance of proper sunscreen use. Use the below listed guidelines by the American Cancer Society:

- Daily use of sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher; reapply every 2 hours or immediately after swimming or excessive sweating.
- Cover up with clothing, broad-brimmed hats, UV blocking sunglasses.
- Seek shade, especially between 10 am and 4 pm.
- Avoid tanning and tanning salons.
- Keep newborns out of the sun. Apply sunscreen to all babies over 6 months old.

See your physician every year for a skin exam.  
Another reminder for summer is being current with our Tetanus vaccinations. If it has been at least 10 years from your last tetanus shot, you will need the vaccine. You can receive the vaccine from your personal physician, city or county nursing agencies.

Tetanus bacteria are always lurking around in dirt and rust. The bacterium enters our body by way of a puncture wound. Gardening, fishing and just running around with bare feet put us at risk of contracting the tetanus bacteria. This bacteria then turns into a toxin which spreads throughout the body, and without protection from the vaccine, can lead to painful muscle spasms and contractions. This is what we commonly call "lockjaw" which can lead to death.

Please take the time now to protect yourself before the summer activities begin.

During the summer months I will continue to offer parish nurse office hours on Mondays from 11-1. Please stop in for a visit.

My door is always open.

Remember that I also have adaptive equipment to loan out for your use. This includes items such as walkers, canes, shower chairs, reachers, and crutches. Please give me a call at the church office (255-1160) to make arrangements for use. All the equipment has been very generously donated by our McCabe members and is in great condition.

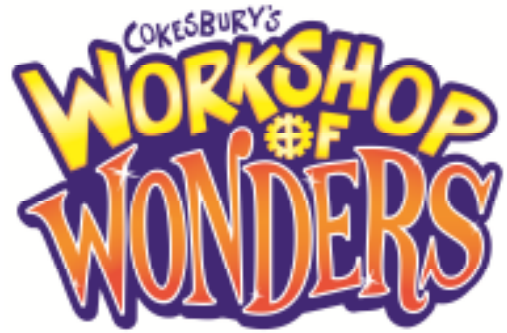

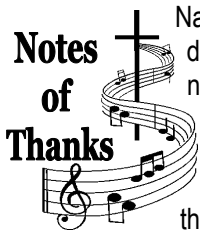

## Take the Summer Challenge!

It's so easy to get caught up in our vacation plans and grow lazy in our church attendance and spiritual life during the summer months. As the following story reveals, God never goes on vacation and we shouldn't find excuses to take a vacation from church. How can we continue on our journey with Christ during the summer months? Try implementing some of the ideas below and use them for inspiration in finding additional ways to keep your family close to Christ!

*Where does God go for summer vacation? A little girl I know pondered that same question not too long ago. Sarah loved Sunday School; she went every Sunday. She liked being in church with her parents... but when summer came- it would all end!*

*Why wasn't there church? Why wasn't there any Sunday School? Where did her friends go? She really was concerned. She wondered why the choir stopped singing on Sundays. Even worse, she wondered why there wasn't church in the summer... when in actuality, her parents would just stop going to church in the summer!*

*The summer was their "time off". Time to lounge in the sun. Time to plan family vacations and weekends away. It was time to concentrate on rest and relaxation. But for Sarah, it was strange not to go to church, see her friends, or be with God.*

*On the day that her family piled into the station wagon to visit their grandmother, Sarah asked her mother, "Mom, where does God go for summer vacation?"*

*Her mother chuckled at the question, and told her God doesn't go on vacation.*

*Sarah wondered, "Why don't we go to church then? Why isn't there any Sunday School? Why don't I get to see my church friends?"*
