Pastor Jenny's Ponderings:

In a recent McCabe Leadership Team meeting, those of us gathered were discussing a particular issue on our agenda when one of our members offered these words: "I think we should always err on the side of generosity." In that moment, an idea was sparked in my brain – sparked, I believe, both by this person's comment *and* by the Holy Spirit. The idea was this: *What if we spent a year exploring the idea of faithful generosity?*

We worship a God whose very heart is marked by generosity. We learn this throughout the Bible, but especially in what is perhaps the most famous, most beloved verse of Christian Scripture: "**God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life**" (John 3:16).

This is the God in whose image we are created (Genesis 1:26-27), and we find ourselves most aligned with God's will and way when we are generous in thought, word, and deed. So, we are going to spend a year – yes, that's right...*a year* – with sermons that somehow have at their heart the concept of faithful generosity.



"But, Pastor Jenny," you might say, "In last month's newsletter, it was reported that McCabe is doing well financially! Why do we need to focus on generosity if giving has been good enough this past year?" Why, indeed! Well, **generosity is not just about money**. In fact, folks who *hate* to hear about money in church are usually pretty quick to point out that generosity and stewardship are not *just* about money! And it's very true. Generosity is *not* just about money – because it's pretty much about everything: every thought we have about ourselves and others...every word we say to (or in reference to) someone else...every moment of our time...every ounce of our talent...and, yes, it is also about every dollar we spend. *Generosity*.

Except for weekends when we have guest preachers, this summer's sermons will be built around the parables and miracles of Jesus. So many of the parables Jesus told are stories *about* God's generosity; and so many of the miracles Jesus performed were *examples of* God's generosity. Beyond the summer, we'll have sermon series about **Christian hospitality** (welcoming of our neighbors), **financial generosity**, the **generosity of Christmas**, **generosity in how we show love to our dear ones** (possibly utilizing Gary Chapman's popular book series *The 5 Love Languages*), the **generous Easter message of the cross and empty tomb**, and, finally, **generosity in prayer** (revival!). This is not set in stone, but this is the direction we're heading and I firmly believe God is in it.

Thankfully, the hearts and minds of McCabe's people already tend to overflow with generosity; you have proven this time and time again in my first year with you – particularly through our Christmas offering and through One Thing. So, thank you. But, I, for one, cannot wait to see what kind of generosity God unleashes through us over the next year!

Wholly Healthy

Someone stated in our exercise class that we have experienced all four seasons in May. Really, what is up with that? I guess we would call this living in North Dakota! So, using my blonde, Norwegian logic I believe that since we had winter in May we should be able to enjoy summer into December! Right?! That's my story and I'm sticking with it! :)

Summer is the perfect time for outdoor picnics and firing up the barbeque grill. I guess picnics in the middle of winter here doesn't make much sense. Oh dear, my point is being aware of food safety during our summer outings.

The CDC estimates that 76 million Americans get sick from food related illnesses every year and more than 300,000 of these people end up hospitalized. Even more frightening is 5,000 of those die from foodborne illness.

Listed below are a few ways to protect ourselves, friends and family from suffering from foodborne illness. (Reference; CDC and USDA)

- Cook meat, poultry and seafood thoroughly. Use a meat thermometer to be sure your grilled meats are "done". Ground beef should be cooked to the internal temp of 160 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Don't cross-contaminate one food with another. Wash your hands, utensils and cutting boards after they have been in contact with raw meat and poultry and before using for another food.
- Bacteria can grow quickly at room temperature and even faster when out on a warm summer day, so refrigerate foods or keep in coolers until ready to cook. Refrigerate or put left-overs in coolers promptly.
- Discard food left out for more than 2 hours (1 hour if temps are above 90 degrees F.)
- Wash produce thoroughly to remove visible dirt, and discard the outermost leaves of a head of lettuce or cabbage.



Hopefully these few reminders will help us enjoy wonderful barbeque feasts without the concern of foodborne illness.

I will continue to offer parish nurse visits every Monday from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the parish nurse office, located by the west entrance. Please drop in. My door is always open. :) Have a wonderful, safe summer!

We Serve God By Serving Others

*Whoever wants to be great must become a servant.
Mark 10:43 (MSG)*

The world defines greatness in terms of power, possessions, prestige, and position. If you can demand service from others, you've arrived. In our *me-first* culture, acting like a servant is not a popular concept.

"It is possible to serve in church for a lifetime without ever being a servant. You must have a servant's heart."

Jesus, however, measured greatness in terms of service, not status. God determines your greatness by how many people you serve, not how many people serve you.

This is so contrary to the world's idea of greatness that we have a hard time understanding it, much less practicing it. The disciples argued about who deserved the most prominent position, and 2,000 years later, people still jockey for position and prominence.

Thousands of books have been written on leadership, but few on servanthood. Everyone wants to lead; no one wants to be a servant. We would rather be generals than privates. Even Christians want to be "servant-leaders," not just plain servants. But to be like Jesus is to be a servant. That's what he called himself.

While knowing your shape is important for serving God, having the heart of a servant is even more important. Remember, God shaped you for service, not for self-centeredness. Without a servant's heart, you will be tempted to misuse your shape for personal gain. You will also be tempted to use it as an excuse to exempt yourself from meeting some needs.

God often tests our hearts by asking us to serve in ways we're not shaped. If you see a man fall into a ditch, God expects you to help him out, not say, "I don't have the gift of mercy or service."

While you may not be gifted for a particular task, you may be called to do it if no one who is gifted at it is around. Your primary ministry should be in the area of your shape, but your secondary service is wherever you're needed at the moment.

Your shape reveals your ministry, but your servant's heart will reveal your maturity. No special talent or gift is


required to stay after a meeting to pick up trash or stack chairs. Anyone can be a servant. All it requires is character.

It is possible to serve in church for a lifetime without ever being a servant. You must have a servant's heart.

How can you know if you have the heart of a servant?

Jesus said, "*You can tell what they are by what they do*" (Matthew 7:16 CEV).

RECAP

In January, we started a mission initiative called **One Thing**. The purpose of **One Thing** is to share the love of Jesus Christ by making a significant impact on **one** non-profit organization each month, or by encouraging folks to do **one** particular thing each month for individuals or groups in our area and around the world. Just as a note, the items we request you donate when we have a **One Thing** collections are items the organization has said are on their "most needed" list. We want to make sure we're collecting items for which they have a significant need! [Here is the recap of the impact we've made so far through One Thing:](#)

January (paper products for Ruth Meier's Hospitality House): 9, 517 paper plates, bowls, cups, and napkins; 4,188 facial tissues; 100 garbage bags; a bag of cotton balls; and a package of aluminum foil!

February: 230+ "love notes" to the people and places of Bismarck-Mandan

March (needed items for the Central Dakota Humane Society): 368 pounds of cat litter; 21 bottles of bleach; 38.1 pounds of dog biscuits; several sheets of postage stamps; 5 boxes of paper clips; and \$180.00 in monetary donations

April (dry goods to the Emergency Food Pantry): 256 requested items like boxes of cereal, pancake & cake mixes, cans of frosting, and boxes of instant potatoes; plus 210 miscellaneous other items

May: \$1,200+ to the Imagine No Malaria campaign (Bishop Ough's Miracle Offering for this June's Annual Conference in Fargo)
