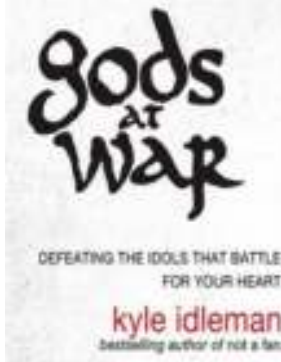

Pastor Jenny's Ponderings: *Lent at McCabe (The Idols We Love: A Holy Tug-of-War)*

"What if I told you that every sin you are struggling with, every discouragement you are dealing with, even the lack of purpose you're living with [is] because of idolatry?"
- Kyle Idleman

Those words are from the introduction to Kyle Idleman's book *Gods at War: Defeating the Idols That Battle for Your Heart*. With biblical wisdom at its core, the lessons of this book get to the very heart of many things with which we all struggle on a daily basis...even though we may not think, at first, to label those struggles as "idols."



During Lent at McCabe, our weekend and Wednesday worship services will center around the themes of Idleman's book *Gods at War*. For our purposes, however, we're calling the series *The Idols We Love: A Holy Tug-of-War*...because the "tug-of-war" image so perfectly captures what it feels like in our hearts and minds when there is a battle going on.

Our Lenten worship services utilizing this *Idols We Love* theme are as follows:

March 4, 5, & 8	introduction to the series
March 11, 12, & 15	idol of ENTERTAINMENT
March 18, 19, & 22	idols of ACHIEVEMENT & SUCCESS
March 25, 26, & 29	idol of MONEY
April 1, 2, & 5	idol of FAMILY
April 8 & 9	<i>Celebration of Palm Sunday</i>

The weekend worship services will include a more traditional sermon message related to our tug-of-war with each "idol." During the Wednesday services, the messages will be short monologues offered from the perspective of a biblical character who can speak to the week's particular "idol."

Through this series, may God's Holy Spirit challenge and bless us this Lent!

From Your Pastoral Care Team: Pre-Op Prayer

One of the greatest privileges we have as members of your pastoral care team is being and praying with you in times of anxiety and concern: the time before you enter the operating room being one such time.

Whenever time and logistics allow, it is our sincere desire to offer prayerful support before you have surgery. Until now, however, we hadn't had a formal system in place for how best to do that! Here is the process God led us to create:

Step 1: You inform the church office you are having surgery.

Step 2: When we know your surgery date, one of us will put that date on our calendar so we can plan to pray with you before your surgery starts. Except for times when we are out of town or otherwise unable to be there, we will follow the below schedule for pre-op prayer:

<u>Monday surgeries:</u>	Pastor Mark
<u>Tuesday surgeries:</u>	Pastor Darrel
<u>Wednesday surgeries:</u>	Nurse Jane
<u>Thursday surgeries:</u>	Pastor Jenny
<u>Friday surgeries:</u>	Pastor Darrel

Step 3: Whichever one of us plans to pray with you pre-op will call you the day before to ensure we know what time your surgery is set to begin.

Step 4: Barring any logistical issue at the surgery site, we will arrive to pray with you before the surgical team takes you to the operating room.

Of course, if it is your strong preference that we not come pray with you prior to a surgical procedure, we will honor that. But please know we want to be there if you'll have us!

What's Happening with the Money from the 1st Street Parsonage Sale?

That's a great question! The house sold in mid-August, 2016, and we began with \$260,000 from the sale. The first thing that happened was that \$16,000 of the sale money was used to pay off remaining expenses from the parking lot expansion project that was completed in the summer of 2015. Since then, the remaining sale money has been waiting to be spent! Over the course of the fall of 2016, Leadership Team, Trustees, and Finance worked together and approved spending portions of the parsonage sale money on the following items:

1. **\$30,00 for needed maintenance and upgrades to our sanctuary organ** (this work will be completed in July of 2017).
2. **\$18,885 for a new sound system in the Great Hall;** this will replace the two speaker systems that are currently in use (one of which was brought into the Great Hall from the sanctuary approximately 10 years ago!); this upgrade will better support the band for our contemporary worship service and will serve well any events in the Great Hall where sound amplification, projection, and live music will be utilized. Even though \$18,885 was approved for use from the house sale money, much less will actually be used for the purchase of this new sound system; The McCabe Foundation had over \$12,000 of 2016 interest money to spend, so they agreed to spend that money on the Great Hall sound system. ***In the end, only about \$5,000 of the house sale money will go toward the new Great Hall sound system.***

With all that in mind, we still have approximately \$214,000 of the parsonage sale money to use for capital improvements. **Surely God is at work dreaming of other ways we can faithfully put this money to good use as we seek to build Christ's Kingdom in this place!** We covet your prayers and your holy dreams: stay tuned for more updates in the coming months!

Greetings in the name of the Risen Christ,

Mike Slaughter says it bluntly: God is always speaking. The question is: Are we listening? God speaks to people because they are listening.
