

Pastor Jenny's Ponderings: *Let's 'Imagine No Malaria' as our One Thing in May!*

Walking around stores this past month, it's clear summer is almost here: you see all sorts of swimsuits, shorts, flip-flops, sunscreen, and, of course, bug spray! As of this writing, I haven't yet noticed any mosquitoes outside, but I know they're coming...and they are nobody's favorite part of the animal kingdom. Thus, the bug spray. However, for the most part, around here mosquitoes are more of a nuisance than a serious health concern (though those of you who have experience with West Nile may disagree on that point!). ***Contrast that with the continent of Africa where malaria remains a critical health threat for millions of people in many countries: and malaria starts with a simple mosquito bite.***



According to www.imagenomalaria.org, "someone with malaria experiences a high fever, chills, joint pain and headaches. Left untreated, symptoms eventually advance to organ failure. **Nearly 90 percent of malaria's victims are children under the age of 5 and pregnant women.**" And, unfortunately, every 60 seconds malaria ends another life in sub-Saharan Africa. But, guess what? Malaria is 100% preventable!

Over the past many years, The United Methodist Church has been a primary partner with a campaign called Imagine No Malaria. **Since its start, the Imagine No Malaria campaign has made the following things possible in Africa:** the distribution of 2,300,000+ insecticide-treated bed nets, the communication of malaria prevention information via radio to 4,600,000+ people, the maintenance of 300+ clinics across the continent, and the training of 11,600+ health workers.

The Imagine No Malaria campaign has a \$75 million dollar goal and we United Methodists across the globe have committed to completing that goal by April of 2016! The campaign has reached \$65 million so far and our Dakotas bishop, Bishop Bruce Ough, is inviting us Dakotans to contribute toward the Imagine No Malaria goal as part of a miracle offering during Annual Conference this June. Imagine No Malaria is our One Thing for May here at McCabe. Though we will not typically have a monetary donation as our monthly One Thing mission focus, it makes so much sense as a way for us to work together to respond to Bishop Ough's invitation. He has set for the Dakotas a \$100,000 goal for this miracle offering and I have no doubt McCabe will respond generously to help reach that goal. In fact, I will set the pace with a \$100 gift toward it. Will you join me? Director of Discipleship Position Update:

In early January we opened our search for a Director of Discipleship. In the absence of an Associate Pastor, McCabe's Staff-Parish Relations Committee (now Leadership Team), worked with a ministry coach, Rev. Sue Nilson Kibbey, to develop a job description for someone who could "fill the void" where the Associate Pastor had always been. (Our last AP was moved to another appointment in 2013 and, unfortunately, there are not currently enough Dakotas United Methodist clergy for us to receive another one in the foreseeable future.) **As they worked together, they realized our need was not for another Associate Pastor, but, rather, was for someone who could put all of their energy and focus into the area of Christian discipleship:** our life-long pathway of developing and growing in our relationship with Jesus Christ. The Director of Discipleship will help us strengthen existing small group ministries, start new and ongoing small groups, and will continue to build age-level ministries at McCabe.

This will be no small task – especially because we've never had anyone help us do this exact kind of thing before! (Which is the case in many United Methodist churches, by the way.) **So far, we have not moved forward in the hiring process for our Director of Discipleship.** We have received many applications, but have yet to receive one from a candidate who possesses the right balance of significant experience and United Methodist-compatibility. We are confident our Director of Discipleship is out there somewhere, so the search continues!

Pray for our search. Pray that we will be ready to receive this person and the ministry they will build. And please do not hesitate to talk to any of us about how the search is going or about the details of the position. In fact, the first couple of Sundays in May, members of the Leadership Team will stick around for a few minutes in the clerestory (behind the sanctuary) or Great Hall gathering space after the 10 a.m. and 11:15 a.m. worship services; feel free to chat with them about this or anything else related to McCabe's ministry and mission – joys and concerns!



"What are ways I could serve / be serving in the church?"

Answer: According to the Bible, every Christian has been given at least one spiritual gift to use in service to the body of Christ. "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. To him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen" (1 Peter 4:10–11; compare Ephesians 4:11–16). So, ideally, the first step in determining how to serve in the church is for every believer to discover what his/her spiritual gifts are. Usually, the gifts are related to

areas in our lives which unmask our greatest strengths—administration, teaching, hospitality, etc. (see Romans 12:6–8; 1 Corinthians 12:4–11,28).

There is a difference between the Body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:12–13) and the local church Christians that attend corporate worship (Hebrews 10:25). But there is no difference in how Christians ought to use their spiritual gifts, because serving God is a twenty-four-hour proposition, not a Sunday-only enterprise. For example: if one has the gift of exhortation (encouraging people to be all God desires), the blessing of the gift should not be limited to the local body of believers. All Christians everywhere should be serving God in their local churches and looking for opportunities to serve outside the walls of a church building (2 Corinthians 9:12–13). It may be difficult to discover which spiritual gift(s) God has bestowed, but it's better to serve anywhere there is a need than nowhere at all (Romans 12:11). Often, the discovery of gifts becomes more clear in the doing—as we serve in various jobs, we learn what we are good at and what we have a heart for (1 Chronicles 28:9).

Every local congregation has more needs than willing workers; this was true in Christ's day and is still true today (Matthew 9:37). It's never a problem to find a need in the local church. From evangelizing the community (which all Christians are called to do, Mark 16:15) to cleaning the bathrooms, there is always plenty of work to be done. It is good to inquire of the church leadership. Have a conversation with the pastor and/or servant coordinator about what jobs are open and how they may or may not be suited for you.

Here are a few examples of positions of service in local congregations: Sunday School and Bible study teachers, Children and youth leaders, Custodial and maintenance workers to upkeep the building and grounds, Transportation workers for those unable to drive or for children, Outreach workers, Choir members and/or gifted vocalists, Musicians, Music directors, song leaders, etc.

Every member of every church should be serving in some way, and every member of every church should also not forget the most important way to serve one another, which is by love (Galatians 5:14). Serving one another by love may mean offering to babysit while a young couple has a night out, preparing a meal for a family struck by illness, visiting an elderly widow who can't get out of the house, or just taking time to pick up a phone and say, "I was thinking about you today." Christians may busy themselves in tasks of service like the ones listed above, but endless performing, if there is no love involved, is meaningless (1 Corinthians 13:1–3). As we go about serving God and others, let us do so with a spirit of humbleness and brotherly love (Philippians 2:1–4).

Well, it appears that North Dakota was the place to be this winter and spring! Snow in April in the eastern and western parts of the nation! Whew, we made it!! ;) Now, it's time for sunshine and the great outdoors!

This time of year always brings the awareness of safety to mind. Children are excited about their new freedom of play outdoors and are not always aware of their surroundings when chasing a loose ball or when riding their bikes. As drivers, please let us be so very aware of our precious children and be ever so cautious when driving around schools, playgrounds, and neighborhoods with small children. Eyes on the road please!

May is National Fitness and Sports month. We all are very aware of the benefits of physical activity so why is it so difficult to get ourselves moving? I recommend the buddy system. When getting involved in an exercise program it is so easy to talk ourselves out of it. I have come up with many creative excuses usually involving the word, "tomorrow". If we engage a buddy in our activity we have someone else to keep us accountable. Involve a friend or family member. Go out for a walk or a bike ride together as a family after dinner. It's a great opportunity to connect with our children, grandchildren, or a friend. It's amazing how much problem solving can be done or learning how the children are doing while taking a nice walk. Make it a fun adventure! It's a great time to pray and meditate too. Soothes the soul!

There is still time to take advantage of being a part of the Faithfully Fit exercise program right here at McCabe every Monday and Thursday morning from 10:00-11:00. This is the "village" it takes to get me moving!!! Come and join us for fun and fitness. We try to find a lot to laugh about to forget that we are exercising! ;) Our last class of the season is **Thursday, May 21st**.

Just a reminder that I have many adaptive devices such as shower chairs, walkers, reachers, etc. that have been gently used and donated to McCabe for our use. Please contact me if you are interested in borrowing any equipment or if you have equipment to return and are unable to get it back here. Many thanks to all of you who have so generously donated this wonderful equipment to McCabe over the past year(s). It has been well utilized.

I would like to pass along a warning about the dangers found with e-cigarettes. According to an article provided by BreatheND, electronic cigarettes are products designed to deliver nicotine or other substances to a user in the form of a vapor. Typically, they are composed of a rechargeable, battery-operated heating element, a replaceable cartridge that may contain nicotine or other chemicals, and an atomizer that, when heated, converts the contents of the cartridge into a vapor. This vapor can then be inhaled by the user. These products are often made to look like such products as cigarettes, cigars, and pipes. They are also sometimes made to look like everyday items such as pens and USB memory

sticks, for people who wish to use the product without others noticing.

In ND, the same as with conventional cigarettes, they are prohibited in the same places as conventional cigarettes are. What is alarming is the rapid increase in sales to minors, especially 8th-10th graders. In major cities in ND, including Bismarck/Mandan, e-cigarettes cannot be legally sold to minors just as with conventional cigarettes. They are largely unregulated, and in most ND cities, can be sold to minors.

According to BreatheND, teens are using them because they are cool looking and they like to do smoke tricks with them, called "vaping". Manufacturers are targeting kids as so many adults have quit smoking. They use celebrity endorsements, and very appealing ads in teen magazines and social media. Unlike conventional cigarettes, there are no laws preventing ads on TV. They often boast the fruit and candy flavors which are highly appealing to teens.

Breathe ND sent out a flyer with the dangers associated with nicotine poisoning that occurs with the e-cigarette. Were you aware that a 15ml (about 3 teaspoons) bottle of liquid is enough to kill 4 toddlers?! The liquid nicotine can be absorbed through the skin or accidentally eaten. It is vital to keep it out of the reach of children. Signs of nicotine poisoning are dizziness, nausea, headache, vomiting and seizures. Seek immediate medical assistance if poisoning should occur! In 2014, **215** calls to Poison Control were made compared to 1 call in 2010. Please discuss the dangers of the e-cigarette with your children. 


