Pastor Jenny's Ponderings: *On Learning to Talk with God...*

"Prayer seems like it should be so simple. Yet, when it comes to actually praying, often it feels awkward and complicated. I mean...what should you actually pray about? What do you say? Is there anything I should or shouldn't say? Do you have to speak out loud? The truth is, prayer is simple. It's like talking. Talking with a good friend. And the best part? Our God can't wait to talk with us." Those words are from the website for Rev. Adam Weber's new book, *Talking with God: What to Say When You Don't Know How to Pray*.

I have a confession to make: *I don't always know how to pray. I'm a pastor and I do not always know how to pray.* That is my confession. Now. Let me clarify. *Sometimes* I know how to pray. I can *often* tell when God is communicating with me. And I *usually* pay attention. But, I'm human. Prayer does not come perfectly easily for me all the time...which is why I am really looking forward to the sermon series Pastor Mark and I will be preaching for three weeks in May! **On Mother's Day weekend, we are beginning a series based on Adam Weber's new book *Talking with God*.**

Prayer is about communicating with God; and every relationship requires strong communication. (As a relatively newly married person, I know *that* fact now more than I ever did before!) So, it is my sincere hope that, through this *Talking with God* series, each of us will grow in our relationship with God.

The 3 weeks of this series – and their particular themes – are:

May 13 & 14: "Found a Friend"

May 20 & 21: "Short. Simple. Honest."

May 27 & 28: "Chaos Town"

In addition to worship services and sermons that will center around the themes from *Talking with God*, we'll also have the book available for purchase at the church for those wanting to go deeper. (If money is a concern, the book is our gift to you!) So. This May, together, let's learn more about what it means to *talk with God*. Because, as Adam Weber says, our God can't wait to talk with us.

Awana Is A "GO"!

Over the past many months, you've perhaps been hearing bits and pieces about this ministry called "Awana."

For quite some time, we asked you to join us in praying for God's guidance as we considered whether or not God was calling us to launch an Awana ministry at McCabe. After many conversations and meetings,

the excitement grew to a point where it felt a bit silly to say we were simply praying for God's help regarding whether or not we should launch Awana. We wanted to get started! And so, as reported in the April newsletter, **our McCabe Leadership Team voted recently – unanimously and fervently – to launch Awana in the fall of 2017.**



- Our first and primary goal with Awana is to connect with children and families in our neighborhood **who do not yet know Jesus Christ.** (Thankfully, we are confident the children and families already involved at McCabe will be excited to participate, too!)

COMING SOON: A MCCABE BUS (\$\$\$ and Volunteers Needed!)

Months ago, a team of McCabe folks proposed to our Trustees that we consider purchasing a small bus for the primary purpose of bringing to worship folks who might not otherwise be able to make it. The Trustees said “yes” and, with the recommendation of Finance Committee, and the “thumbs up” by our Leadership Team, fundraising has begun! The kind of bus we hope to get would be no larger than 15-passenger (no CDL required to drive it); we'd be looking at a used bus in excellent condition, which will likely cost approximately \$25,000. That said, **our fundraising goal is \$30,000** so we can include insurance, gas, and maintenance costs for 2017. When money is raised, volunteers are in place, and a bus is purchased, the plan is that we would *begin* by picking up residents at a couple of our assisted living facilities and bringing them to our 10:00 worship service. When You See a Need, Act Now

“Never walk away from someone who deserves help; your hand is God’s hand for that person. Don’t tell your neighbor, ‘Maybe some other time’ or ‘Try me tomorrow’ when the money’s right there in your pocket” (Proverbs 3:27-28 MSG).

The last few days we’ve been looking at what the Parable of the Good Samaritan can teach us about demonstrating mercy to those who are hurting. We’ve seen that we must **see the needs around us and sympathize with people’s pain.**

The Good Samaritan also teaches us we must **seize the moment.** Don’t wait, don’t delay, and don’t procrastinate. Do what you can at that moment. Love is not so much something you feel as it is something you do. The Samaritan took action. He stooped down and got on the injured man’s level. He didn’t act superior. He used what he had: wine to disinfect and oil to soothe the wounds. It was the best medication of the day. The Samaritan probably used his own clothes to bandage this guy’s wounds. After all, he’s not a doctor. He didn’t have a medicine cabinet with him. He just served. He did the best he could with what he had.

The Bible tells us in Proverbs 3:27-28, “Never walk away from someone who deserves help; your hand is God’s hand for that person. Don’t tell your neighbor, ‘Maybe some other time’ or ‘Try me tomorrow’ when the money’s right there in your pocket” (MSG). Don’t wait for better conditions. When God calls you to minister to somebody, do it now. When you see a need, meet it now.

To seize the moment, you must be willing to take a risk, though. You must be willing to be interrupted. To be a servant you must move against your fears. Imagine the fears the Samaritan may have faced: “What if the robbers are still in the area? What if this is all a trap? What if he rejects my help? What if I can’t really help him?” We often don’t want to get involved with other people’s pain and brokenness because, quite frankly, it reminds us of our own. But mercy moves in spite of fear.

Mercy touches the untouchable and loves the unlovable.
