## Happy Easter!

It's been quite a Lenten season and April. We were intentional about having the parking lots cleared prior to the Palm Sunday Cantata, Holy Week, and Easter, and then it snowed again. As I look out, once again the parking lots are clear and we're looking forward to clean up beginning around the gardens and lawn.

**Lent:** During Lent, as we wrestled with what it means to engage in a process of spiritual renovation, we averaged over 100 people in worship on Wednesday evenings. We have had 5 generations of people eating at the Wednesday evening meal, and there were nights we were blessed to need to set up additional tables to accommodate every one. Our Wednesday evening/Lenten offerings are being split between a local and global mission. Half of this offering is going to help support camping scholarships. We invest in camping ministries for people in large part because camping can be a momentous, sometimes life changing experience for campers. It is at camp where a high number of people make their first decision to allow Jesus to be their Savior. We have great camping opportunities in the Dakotas.

The other half of the Lenten evening offerings will help support UMCOR operations. The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is repeatedly rated very near the top for the way nonprofits use the money they receive to impact people living in hardship locally, nationally, and globally.

Even though Lent is over, as followers of Jesus, we continue to think about spiritual renovation as a life-long, ongoing process.

**Palm Sunday:** Did you know that on Palm Sunday weekend, the choir helped lead worship by offering the entire Cantata, Behold the Lamb, at three worship services. Over the course of the weekend, we had over 500 people worship at McCabe.

**Holy Week:** From Palm Sunday through Easter Sunday, McCabe offered 16 different worship experiences. We are thankful for the opportunity to celebrate the Palm Sunday High, and experience the instituting of Communion, sinking to the depth of Good Friday, and then celebrating the Easter miracle that is at the core of our faith. Friends, we are people of resurrection and new life!

**Finances:** There is more information included in this newsletter. In a nutshell, thank you for your generosity as we continue to work to be faithful stewards of what God has provided, and as we look ahead and live into where God is leading us.

**South 12<sup>th</sup> St. Property:** At our special charge conference in April, we voted to continue to move forward with selling the property McCabe owns on south 12<sup>th</sup> St. (the former Open Door property). As a result, the real estate people have moved forward with working on completing building inspections, finalizing property pin locations, etc. We anticipate this sale to be completed by May 31. We continue to love partnering with Open Door Community Preschool right here on site at McCabe.

Please help me thank Mark Benesh (Trustees Chair as this process was getting started), Dianna Kindseth (Financial Administrator), and so many who have spent numerous hours researching and coordinating and working to help make this happen in a faithful way as stewards of what God has entrusted us.



**Front Office Administrative Assistant:** We are thankful for Karlee Chase's ministry as our front office person and voice for McCabe since last summer. Karlee has been a positive, efficient servant in this very important role. As Celebrate Recovery moves to Ministry on the Margins (a great fit for these ministries), Karlee will be more available for this ministry and for working with Chris on his others projects. Thanks for your service Karlee!

**We are so thankful to be able to welcome Cassie Miller into the front office role.** Cassie brings a faithful, kind, positive, detail oriented skillset to this position. We're thankful, too, that Cassie and Karlee have had some time to train together to help support a positive transition. Cassie entered into this role during the busiest season in the church year and didn't miss a beat. Welcome Cassie!

**Organist:** A big congratulations goes out to our organist John Clodfelter. John has been offered, and accepted a job as an Assistant Professor in the Music Department at the University of Jamestown. We are thankful for John's ministry at McCabe, and look forward to continuing to worship and serve with him into the summer before he leaves for Jamestown.

**Family Ministries:** We are so appreciative for Tina Mitchell's years of faithful, Christ centered service, and we look forward to continuing to worship and serve alongside one another. Tina will continue serving as the Family Ministries Director through the J.A.M. and Awana year this May.

Vacation Bible School is scheduled as planned.

As we go forward, we are considering our overall children, youth, and family ministries. As you may be aware, we have not had a paid staff member in our youth ministries for almost a year. We are taking the time to rethink our overall youth ministries to include youth group, and all the ministries in which youth engaged. Right now we have about 35 youth participating at McCabe on a weekly basis.

**McCabe Serving in the Community:** Over the course of April, the people of McCabe served over 300 people at The Banquet food service ministry. The people of McCabe delivered Meals on Wheels every day Monday through Friday. Our Solar Oven partnership continues to make a difference.

### **COMING SOON: Worship Live Stream!**

It's taken a while to get this in place, but as of this writing, we are trying to get one last piece in place so we can begin livestreaming. Our intent is to softly begin, then talk about it more broadly from there. We plan to livestream the 9:30 a.m. Sunday Service. Live streaming is a great tool to help fulfill our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world: a live stream extends our worship service to those who are new and hoping to familiarize themselves with McCabe *and* it can keep folks who are already part of McCabe connected when they are out-of-town or stuck at home for one reason or another. **Wireless Study:** Part of our overall capital improvement plan is to make the McCabe building wirelessly accessible. In April we had a wireless study done through McCabe because we do struggle with wireless accessibility throughout the building. We anticipate this work to begin in the weeks after Easter. This project is part of our 2019 capital improvement budget.

Did you know that in our culture wireless accessibility is a basic assumption people have. It's actually an act of hospitality just like it is to have a quality nursery and clean bathrooms. This is no longer a nice option to have available. It's assumed that we will have wireless availability like it's assumed we have a current, up to date website and a social media presence. For generations of people, these are as basic as having bulletins or music during worship.

**Online Giving:** We continue to hear positive comments from people using the online or mobile giving options we have. If you go to our website: [mcca-beumc.com](http://mcca-beumc.com) and enter under the 'GIVE' tab, you'll find an online form that will lead you through the simple process of setting up a one-time or recurring gift. Dianna, our financial administrator, has gone through the process of rigorously vetting our online security with our financial provider. Likewise, if you prefer, we have a mobile app: GivePlus available. I've used both options. In our household, we actually have our offering set up as a weekly automatic billpay directly from our checking account. We also have direct deposit available.

**Celebrate Recovery:** It's an exciting time for Celebrate Recovery. McCabe and The Dakotas Conference have been helping to support this new church plant. May 15<sup>th</sup> will be Celebrate Recovery's last worship/small groups on site at McCabe. We will continue to provide some behind the scenes infrastructure support until Celebrate Recovery has their Board, state permits, etc in place. We're excited to see how God uses this partnership between Celebrate Recovery and Ministry on the Margins into the future. As followers of Jesus, it has been, and it is, a privilege to serve and grow with the people of CR, the people of McCabe, and The Dakotas Conference, as this ministry continues to establish and solidify the foundation upon which they are building.

**Worship Discernment Process:** We continue to do some preliminary work as we move into developing recommendations for restructuring our worship schedule. We anticipate the end timelines to be similar, but we want to be intentional about working together and entering this process in a caring, faithful manner that will result in expanding our ability to offer vibrant, fruitful worship. We have a great team of people ready and assembled representing a cross section of McCabe. Prior to this team beginning to meet, our next step forward is being intentional about hearing the thoughts of all McCabe staff as they will be a big part in making this happen in a faithful way.

**Communications:** We have some exciting discussions continuing and taking more shape about how we're communicating with the world beyond our walls. There's an intentional look taking place at some of our marketing and branding.

**Annual Conference Delegates:** The Dakotas UMC Annual Conference is in Bismarck in June. If you might be interested in attending, there are a number of ways this can happen. Please feel free to visit with us if you have any questions or thoughts.

**60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary:** As of the first weekend in April, our current McCabe building turned 60 years old. Marti Knutson is exploring pulling together a team for a celebration sometime this summer. If you'd like to be part of this team, please visit with Marti.

## From The Office of the Financial Administrator

### Financial Results:

Year to date through April 17, 2019:

#### Current Fund:

### Ministry Notes:

The mortgage balance is \$484,064 after the April mortgage payment.

The upgrade project for building wide wireless internet access has been paid for and will proceed when the equipment arrives. This project was funded with designated funds contributed in 2018. Capital asset improvements to date that have been funded with Foundation grants and designated funds total \$45,010.

Special gifts received in December 2018 and April 2019 and not yet designated by the Board of Directors total \$119,400.

General fund reserves for the long-term support of the Current Fund total \$100,000. Additional reserves of \$73,660 were restricted by the Board of Directors to support the 2019 budget year.

Building Debt, Property, and Equipment Fund reserves (which include funds designated for the payment of the mortgage) total \$75,247. (Carryover funds were \$55,794 and 2019 year to date funds in excess of giving are \$19,453.) The Board of Directors is in the process of establishing a future capital needs budget and goals for the funding of a long-term reserve for building, property, and equipment maintenance and upgrades.

**Pastoral Transition:** I still love Jesus. I still love the people of McCabe. I am still called by God to make disciples of Jesus Christ. ## Prayer Corner

**Eastertide.** Easter Season is very important in the Christian calendar because it celebrates on the one hand the risen Christ with his appearances and teachings and on the other hand the beginnings of the Christian church. Historically, the term Pentecost was used to refer not only to the last day in the fifty days between Easter and Pentecost, but also to the entire period as well. Now the practice is to reserve the term for Pentecost Sunday and to refer to the fifty-day period as the Easter Season, or Eastertide.
