Wrestling with God. In my own life, I find myself continually wrestling with God. I am so thankful for the people of McCabe as together, we wrestle with how we continue to faithfully grow and serve together as Christ's living body.

Worship: Your faithfulness in worshipping God and being there for one another is making a difference. With your support, worship continues to be the primary way most people connect with God through McCabe.

Did you know McCabe is currently offering at least 8 worship experiences over the course of the week? We have worship options for people wherever they are in their faith journey. Right now, our new Wednesday evening service is our second biggest worship experience each week.

Together we are intentionally offering opportunities for **people to experience God's life-saving work through Jesus Christ.** Your faithfulness makes a difference!

Children and Youth:

Sunday morning JAM (Jesus and Me) – Compared to years past, our Sunday morning children's ministry numbers are moving in the right direction. To continue to build and develop a vibrant Sunday morning children's ministry, we continue seeking people who might be feeling nudged to offer some time once in a while through this ministry.

Wednesday evening Awana – Our numbers continue to be up over last year. We have faithful leaders and assistants of all ages throughout this ministry. As this ministry continues to develop, we continue to have opportunities for people to engage in helping children

meet the living Christ on Wednesday evenings.

Youth – Our youth are active across McCabe in so many ways. On a Wednesday evening, for example, you will find youth sharing a meal, worshipping, in a small group called Trek, in Confirmation (Year 1 or Year 2), and in Youth Group. Around 25 youth went shopping for Christmas Shoeboxes recently on a Wednesday evening.

Youth Cohort – As part of our Youth Cohort training we are in the process of building an overall system for tracking children and youth engagement across McCabe.

Stewardship – A Way of Life. We're using the language Stewardship – A Way of Life because stewardship is about ordering and reordering all that God has given us to be used in faithful, authentic ways.

Why We Give: The number one reason people give is because of a belief in the mission. For me, I believe the mission of Jesus Christ, loving God and neighbor, making disciples, and bringing hope and healing to the world, is the greatest mission we can support. McCabe exists and engages in worship and ministry to make a difference in the lives of people.

Please know, too, that we take seriously the privilege and responsibility of faithfully using what has been given through McCabe.

- Ultimately, we give as a way of investing in something bigger than ourselves.
- We give to invest in reaching new people and caring for the people here.

We give in response to God's generosity in our lives.

Estimate of Giving Cards, or pledge cards, have been sent out. As we are working to faithfully prepare a budget for 2019, any input you can offer is helpful in establishing the 2019 budget. We are consecrating to God our estimates of giving during worship in the first week of November.

New Small Groups: We have people serving and studying in so many ways. Recently on a Wednesday evening, we had three new small groups for adults start.

With the upcoming new calendar year, we are also anticipating a new round of Financial Peace University, and we're planning to offer Griefshare opportunities for the first time through McCabe.

We are continually challenged to be thankful for all that God has given us, and to faithfully wrestle with how and where God is calling us to use these gifts for Kingdom purposes.

Church Conference: Our annual Church, or Charge, Conference is scheduled for November 4th at 4:00 pm at Calvary UMC. This will be a gathering of 10 or so United Methodist Churches from across the region. All the churches present will have their Charge Conference at the same time.

Church Meeting: As a result, we continue to plan for a McCabe all church meeting in early December to visit about where we've been, where we're going, budget, ministry accomplishments and hopes, and so forth. The date for the meeting has not yet been finalized.

Budget: We are in the process of developing a 2019 budget draft for your Board to consider. We are planning for an all church meeting in early December to provide and receive input in where we've been and where God seems to be leading us.

Apportionments: Your Board recently made the intentional decision to stay current on our apportionments. The goal of the Board is to pay the amount due for the month, at the end of the month.

Mortgage: By the end of 2019, your Board's goal for the building mortgage is to be under \$500,000. If possible, we would like to have the mortgage paid off by the end of 2019.

End of the Year: Because of your financial faithfulness in 2018 we have paid off some of our 2017 debt we carried over, and we are current on our 2018 bills. Through your faithfulness, and some generous gifts (including estate gifts) we have been able to pay off some bills while also beginning to establish a solid cash reserve to better position us for the future.

Cash Reserves: While our cash reserve is not quite where we'd like it to be fully funded, we are reestablishing a solid financial footing. As mentioned, the mortgage is about \$500,000. We are working to aggressively pay this off. Then our goal will be to establish a faithful capital cash reserve for capital expenses. Through your faithfulness, we have

made strong progress. With your help, we will continue to position McCabe for the near future and for the long-term future financially.

Visitation Team: Did you know we have faithful and active servant leaders intentionally extending McCabe's congregational care through visitation ministries? These servants visit people. Some bring Communion to others. These individuals are instrumental in helping to care for the people of McCabe. While we have around 960 members, we affiliate with about 3,000 on a regular basis. Together, we are the body of Christ.

Missions:

Shoebboxes: Hundreds of Christmas shoebboxes are being wrapped and packed for children who might not otherwise receive a Christmas present. Last year McCabe sent about 500 shoebboxes. We will continue to collect these shoebboxes until November 11th.

Free Clothing Rummage Sale:

Your generosity helped the youth of McCabe be the hands and feet of Jesus as they provided free quality, clean clothing to people who needed it.

Bismarck Emergency Food Pantry:

One receipt at a time, McCabe was the major contributor that helped The Bismarck Emergency Food Pantry receive a \$1,000 donation from Dan's Supermarket.

Free Little Food Pantry:

The Free Little Food Pantry in front of the church is repeatedly restocked to help people who are food insecure.

Rummage Sale: There were a lot of people through the building for the Rummage Sale and so much more.

Wednesday Meal: We feed around 75-100 people every Wednesday evening at the church.

Solar Oven Partners: Last month, Solar Oven Partners received \$1,403 from the people of McCabe.

Missionaries: One of our missionaries serving in the Caribbean received \$500.

UMCOR Kits: \$1,730 was given to support UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) kits.

We have not yet paid out all of our missional commitments as we continue to monitor our cash flow into December.

Open Door Property: Three commercial reality companies have been interviewed and Daniels Company has been selected to market and manage prospective buyers for us.

Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas and more: Right now we are in the midst of final-

izing our upcoming special worship service schedule.



McCabe Foundation

The McCabe United Methodist Church Foundation plans to celebrate reaching a Milestone in its operation at services November 17 and 18, 2018. Special celebration plans are being made to occur between Worship Services after the 8:00 a.m. Service on November 18.

The Foundation began with a major gift of \$223,000 and through growth and additions has reached a value in the million-dollar range. From that time up to the present it has paid out \$400,000 of divi-

dends and interest to Education Grants and additional qualifying purposes benefiting McCabe and its membership. The Principal is not accessible.

The McCabe United Methodist Foundation has been affiliated with McCabe Church since 1991 and is operated as a separate Corporation by a Committed Board of Directors. The purpose is to provide and perpetuate the Christian belief of McCabe United Methodist Church through support of Christian Education

and related functions. It qualifies as a 501 (c)(3) organization and as such enjoys tax benefits through Endowments meeting Federal and State tax benefits to folks making donations.

The Celebration is particularly timely as we are nearing the end of the year, tax time, and opportunity for people seeking a lasting Legacy and service to Christ. For further information contact any Board Member whose names are on record in the church office.
