When I was asked to be your pastor I had no idea how quickly I would fall in love with the people of McCabe UMC. Thank you one and all for your commitment to be a part of the living and breathing body of Christ. Thank you for attending, volunteering, and supporting God's ministry through this wonderful church.

I'm writing to ask you to be in prayer for our church. On Sunday, October 14th, we are kicking off a fund drive called: "Imagine No Debt." I believe God is calling us to pay off the debt, so we can do even greater things.

The McCabe building project cost approximately \$3,654,000. We raised about \$1.2 million and borrowed \$2,450,000. The currently balance is \$1.7 million. Our last fund drive raised enough money to pay our monthly payments for three years, but didn't gain ground on the principal (a few gifts were received toward the corpus.) Therefore, this year we will pay \$92,000 in interest.

Our goal is to pay off the debt and we need to remember that we will still accrue \$144,544 in interest by paying equal payments over the next three years.

As members of Christ's Body we have the opportunity to live our lives as a reflection of God's love for us. As God loved us through the gift of Jesus Christ we are to respond in kind by loving God, ourselves, and our neighbors (the Greatest Commandment). We show our love for God through our faithful living and through our faithful giving. God calls us to give the gifts of our tithe (10%) and our offerings.

My family and I moved to Bismarck in July, of 2004. (I became your pastor at McCabe in 2010.) Sarah and the boys have been active at McCabe for the past nine years. We can tell you firsthand about the benefits of McCabe's remodeling and building program. Our family arrived during the mess of construction and rejoiced in the beauty of our church building reborn. The Bakers' enjoy the opportunity to participate in the ministry of this church and in the opportunity to help fund this wonderful church through the general fund and the building fund. We are joyful givers. We give our tithe and we give our offerings. They are our spiritual gift to God and this church.

McCabe UMC has participated in three prior campaigns to pare down our debt, but we have a long way to go. I invite you to "Imagine No Debt." Imagine what we can do if we were free of this burden.

McCabe is Doing Great Things:

Great things are happening at McCabe because we had the vision to remodel and build an addition to the church. Our worship attendance has grown for three straight years and in the first six months of 2012 we have increased our worship attendance by an average of 30 people per week. Most of our recent growth is found in our Contemporary Worship Service. The Great Hall is a wonderful location for this service, because it provides an informal atmosphere with plenty of natural light.

Our music program is second to none. Our chancel choir and bell choir have been blessed with wonderful rooms to practice their music and store their equipment. This space has been invaluable to their efforts. Our traditional worship service is blessed by their gifts.

Did you know the gym has become one of the most used spaces in our church? It's used by the youth (Wednesday and Sunday) and young adults (Monday); our children's group Rusty Staples (two Wednesday's a month), the Save America's Youth (S.A.Y.) Yes program (Monday and Tuesday), and people who enjoy playing basketball. We've been blessed with the opportunity to open our gym to the community by hosting a new group – the Junior Varsity Dance group, the Bismarck High School Demonettes. Because of the limited space in our public schools they needed to find space for their practices, three nights a week. It's wonderful that we can serve these kids, their families, and our schools by opening our doors wide.

I'm thankful for your vision to be a church that is reaching beyond itself. McCabe supports programs in our community: Open Door Community Center, S.A.Y. Yes, Meals on Wheels, the Banquet, and Rebuilding Together. We also reach around the world through our United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) kits, sends people and money to support the Haiti Solar Oven Program, and support church mission and growth through United Methodist projects around the world.

We have so many volunteers doing so many things that they are hard to list. I thank everyone: teachers, UMW, mission workers, office workers, decorators, cooks, gardeners, lawn mowers, staff, and everyone who works quietly behind the scenes. We are doing great things because of you.

God has blessed our church and we are living as a blessing to God's people.

Why Us? Why Now?

Hi! I'm Pastor Dave Biebighauser, invited by the Administrative Board and the Finance Committee to assist in the capital campaign entitled, "Imagine No Debt!" I'm very happy to be invited into your Church for this purpose. Thank you for your faithful discipleship! This is indeed a beautiful and versatile building in which to do ministry in Christ's name here in Bismarck. We come now to the time for addressing the remaining \$1,700,000.00 debt on this Church, as well as underwriting the general budget of the Church for 2013.

For the past nine years we have been involved in fundraising to pay for our building project. For seven years we have been working to pay our 2.8 million dollar loan. During that time, we have been able to lower the principle to \$1.7 million. Presently, it is costing around \$92,000.00 per year in interest. Our goal for this campaign is to raise enough in cash and pledges, over the next three years, to pay the debt! "Imagine, No Debt!" Imagine what new and exciting forms of ministry this congregation will enter into when we no longer have this burden.

So, why now? Because it is time to say "thank you Lord" for those who have gone before us. Yes, we have reaped the blessings of a remodeled building for over seven years. Let's pay it off within the next three years and free ourselves for more exciting work for Christ in the future! What a testimony to our faithfulness that we can free this building of debt in a total of 10 years, and provide an operating budget for our Church to do effective ministry in 2013.

So why us? As the many previous generations of faithful Christians have given us this space in which to worship and serve God, so we too must provide a debt free space for the generations following us. Our children, youth, young families, and members of all ages will be blessed to come to know a loving and forgiving God because of our faithfulness in this campaign!

Giving is a very Spiritual and faith filled experience. It is unlike any other monetary endeavor in which we are engaged. So I'd like to ask that as you receive, in just a few short days, more information about this campaign, that you would ask yourself two questions;

- 1) What are the monetary and material blessings that God has entrusted to my stewardship?
- 2) What is God asking me to freely give toward this campaign?

To reach our goals for both the debt reduction as well as the 2013 budget we will need folks who can step up to the plate and hit a home run for God! Regardless of our own financial capabilities may we just simply, "Give as the Lord has blessed us, with the tithe being our goal."

McCabe Youth

I hope your family is taking part in McCabe's FamilyLink devotions. I am very happy with our effort to emphasize the importance of family in the church. This is particularly important in regards to how youth grow in their spiritual walks. Statistically youth, whose parents are active in their faith development, are more likely to maintain their faith once they grow into adulthood. I've challenged all the youth in our gatherings to ask "what type of a person do I want to be when I am an adult." It's important to understand that the choices young people make today are going to affect who they become later in life. Ultimately, parents set the precedent when it comes to faith development. Here are a few points for parents to keep in mind:

1. **SHOW.** If you're a Christian, you are Christ's representative to the world. Is your faith life exemplary or is it docile? Do you get excited about your faith and about church activities or are they a burden to you? Look for opportunities to reach out to others and know when to turn off the TV, computer, etc. Your kids are watching even when you don't realize it and they will be picking up the same habits and attitudes that you portray whether good and bad.

2. **TALK.** It's great to show your faith to your kids, but do you talk about it too? Look for teachable moments throughout your day. When you see something on TV that you know is morally wrong, do you discuss it with your children? Many parents are scared to bring up spiritual topics with their kids primarily because they don't know how to adequately explain what they believe for themselves. This is where knowing Scripture is very important. In our world of moralistic relativism, people say it's OK to believe whatever you want as long as you're sincere. What would Scripture say about that? If our youth don't have a firm foundation to stand on, then they will get pulled under by the rising tide of individualistic narcissism that is running rampant in our culture.

3. **PRAY.** Praying for your kids cannot be over-emphasized because it's so easy to forget to do so. It's so simple, yet so powerful. May we be constantly reminded to pray. We can always be better pray-ers than we were yesterday.

These are simple points I know you've heard before; however, reminders are good because I know I often fail to do them as adequately as I should. That's why God's grace is so great! He provides for us even when we fail to live up to His perfect standards. I pray for a greater understanding of God's faithfulness to us during our moments we spend with our family. Your family will emulate your example whether good or bad. May

God help us focus on that which is true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent, and praise-worthy (Philippians 4:8).


We're Tooting Our Horn!

Wholly Healthy



Greetings McCabe friends,

Autumn and all its glorious color and beauty is here! We are certainly enjoying a summer-like autumn so far! Please take time out from the busyness of our lives to enjoy God's wonders. Last year, a parishioner pointed out a 'God-thing' in our very own west parking lot. This gift has returned to us again this year. You may have noted the maple tree, on the north side of the west parking lot, is entirely green with the exception of a beautiful, blazing orange cross among the green! God is good!

October is also the opener for my 'hunting season'. Yes, you guessed it. Time for flu shots! I will be offering flu shots to those 18 and older beginning Saturday, October 20 from 4:30-5:00 p.m., Sunday, October 21 from 9:00-10:00 a.m. and again after the Contemporary worship service. I will continue to offer flu shots during my parish nurse office hours on Mondays from 11:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. until I run out of vaccine. All vaccines will be administered in the parish nurse office located by the west entrance.

All you will need to get the flu vaccine is your insurance/Medicare card and a brave heart. I will not collect any cash. You will be asked to complete an insurance form, which has been simplified this year, and sign a consent to receive the vaccine. Your insurance information will be submitted to your insurance company by the business office at Sanford Health Systems. You do not have to be a client of Sanford to receive the vaccine. You will then be billed for the flu shot if your insurance does not cover the cost of the vaccine. Medicare covers the cost of the flu shot in full.

I will be offering the regular flu shot. Please check with your personal physician regarding receiving the high-dose vaccine for those 65 and older, the nasal-spray vaccine for healthy, non-pregnant people ages 2 to 49, and the new intradermal flu shot for those 18-64 years of age. According to the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention), the intradermal vaccine is injected into the skin instead of the muscle. This shot uses a much smaller nee-

dle (90% smaller than needles used for regular flu shots) and requires 40% less antigen to be as effective as the regular flu shot. The antigen is the part of the vaccine that helps your body build up protection against the flu viruses.

Some common side effects with the intradermal flu shot include redness, swelling, toughness, pain, and itching at the injection site. Other side effects, as with the regular flu shot, includes headache, muscle ache, and tiredness. These symptoms usually go away within 3 to 7 days.

Of course, the best defense against the flu is good hand washing! Please take extra care in washing your hands or use a hand sanitizer often. We also need to remind ourselves to keep our hands away from our face. We can easily transmit all those little 'bugs' when we touch our nose, mouth and especially the eyes. Did I forget to mention that we really do need to wash our hands?! OK, I've annoyed you long enough!

If you have any questions regarding the flu shot or have any other concerns or would like me to visit you, please contact the church office at 255-1160.

Please enjoy the beauty of the season. God provides many wonders for us to discover. Take the time for an adventure of the senses.




