I forget who said this, but I remember this timely quote, "Humility is like underwear, essential, but indecent if it shows."

McCabe United Methodist Church will take a special offering on Sunday, September 29, for the purchase of Military Biblesticks. Founded some 40 years ago, **Faith Comes By Hearing** provides an entire audio of the New Testament and the book of Psalms to our soldiers serving throughout the world. These are pocket-sized and thus easy to have with them at all times.

The cost is \$25 for each stick and this includes an opportunity for the recipient's loved one at home to also receive a copy. More than 200,000 Military Biblesticks have been provided to chaplains who share them with our troops from all branches of services.

McCabe sees this as an opportunity to reach out to those serving around the world in a positive way showing their love and the love of the Lord Jesus Christ. Anyone interested in helping to support this project is welcome to send a check to McCabe designating it for military Biblesticks or to visit the church on September 29 and participate in one of our worship services which will be at 8:00, 10:00 and 11:15 a.m.

Nancy Bjella's Gift to McCabe

1 pair sewing scissors

Wrap notions in the fabric and place items in sealed one gallon plastic bag.

2 full size flat sheets

2 pillow cases

2 pillows

FRY BREAD KITS (these are a Conference project and will go to Spirit Lake)

4# sugar

5# flour

32 oz. cooking oil

1 small can baking powder

These may be placed in a plastic grocery bag.


