Pastor Jenny's Ponderings: A Generous Welcome

As I write this newsletter article, I'm three days away from the "Docs, Crocs, Scholars, & Frocks" fundraising event for The Welcome House. By the time you read this, my 1-mile swim will be long over and all funds will have been raised. But, right now, as I sit at my office desk, the event is on my mind – and, despite my lack of training for it, I truly am excited. The Welcome House is a local, faith-based non-profit that seeks to assist persons experiencing homelessness...and the need for that kind of assistance is a growing one in our community.

I truly love the mission of The Welcome House. I also simply love its name: "The Welcome House." It's obviously a very appropriate name for a homeless shelter, but it challenges me to remember how appropriate a name it would be for any *church*. We are McCabe United Methodist Church, but we are absolutely called by God to be a "welcome house" for all who come through our doors – really, for all we encounter in our lives and world. And, to be a house of welcome, we must have hearts and minds that are generous and hospitable toward others.

Homecoming Weekend is September 12th and 13th. This is the week many of our discipleship programs will get started again; it's also the weekend when many folks will begin more regular worship attendance after summer travels. 



Spiritual Gifts

Following and in the next few Messengers you will find the descriptions of Spiritual Gifts that are listed in the Bible. What are your Spiritual Gifts and how are you using them? Faith - Greek: pistis = faith in God, a personal surrender to God with a conduct inspired by such surrender, moral conviction, assurance

The ability to recognize what God wants done, and to act when others fall back in doubt. Although as Christians we are all called to have faith, people with the spiritual gift of Faith receive it in an extraordinary measure. Even in the face of barriers that overwhelm others, people with this gift simply have confidence that God will see God's will done. Believing deeply in the power of prayer, they also know that God is both present and active in their lives. People with this gift, by their works and by their words, show others that God is faithful to God's promises. Matthew 9:1-2, Matthew 9:20-22, 1 Timothy 6:11-12, Acts 14:22a

Giving - Greek: metadidomi = to give over, share impart
The ability to give material wealth freely and joyfully, knowing that spiritual wealth will abound as God's work is advanced. Those with the gift of Giving are not always affluent but are always generous with what they DO have. People with this gift usually manage their finances well, may have a special ability to make money, and tend to be frugal in their lifestyle. They use these skills to increase their support for God's work, and trust that God will provide for their needs. They are often comfortable and successful in approaching others for gifts. Instead of asking, "How much of my money do I give to God?" they ask, "How much of God's money do I keep?" Luke 3:11, Romans 12:8, 1 Thessalonians 2:8, Mark 12:41-44

Healing - Greek: charisma = a spiritual endowment, a divine gratuity, a religious qualification, iama = cures, healings
The ability to bring wholeness – physical, emotional, or spiritual – to others. People with this gift listen skillfully as they seek God's guidance to learn the needs of the sick and to determine the causes and nature of an illness. They believe that God can cure and that prayer can overcome any negative forces at work (but they also recognize that God might have a different plan). Their tools include prayer, touch, and spoken words. This gift shows God's power; at the same time, it is to God's glory. The goal of healing is not just healing itself, but spreading the gospel by pointing to the power of Jesus Christ and to show the glory of God. Matthew 4:23, Luke 9:11b, Acts 10:37-38, Acts 19:11-12

Helps (Serving) - Greek: diakonia = attendance, aid, relief, service, ministry

The ability to work alongside others in performing practical and often behind-the-scenes tasks to sustain and enhance the body of Christ. A person with this gift receives spiritual satisfaction from doing everyday necessary tasks; he or she may prefer to work quietly and without public recognition. When a need is seen, the helper frequently takes care of it without being asked. The helper's work often frees up other persons so that they may carry out their own ministries. Hebrews 6:10, 2 Timothy 4:11, Acts 24:22-23, Philippians 2:25-30

Hospitality - Greek: philoxenos = fond of guests, i.e. hospitable, given to hospitality

The ability to make others feel welcome and comfortable. People with the gift of hospitality often love to entertain. Sometimes, however, their gift is simply demonstrated by a warm handshake or hug, a bright smile, and a tendency to greet new people and help them get acclimated to a new place or situation. People are drawn to persons with this gift – they often have many acquaintances or friends and help others make connections, too. 1 Peter 4:9-10, Romans 12:13, Titus 1:1-8, 1 Timothy 3:2
