## Pastor Jenny's Ponderings: "Earn. Save. Give. Wesley's Simple Rules for Money"

*"Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can."*

The above quote is often attributed to John Wesley, the father of the Methodist side of our United Methodist family tree. I say "often attributed to" because, as much as we United Methodists like to quote him as saying this, he didn't actually say it. However, the reason this quote is so often attributed to John Wesley is that it certainly *seems like* something he'd say! After all, **John Wesley did clearly and frequently discuss what we sometimes refer to as the "three simple rules" for Christian living: 1) do no harm, 2) do good, and 3) stay in love with God.** "Do no harm" and "do good" are well in line with those words about doing "all the good you can, etc." But, I digress. A little.

Beginning the second weekend in October, we'll spend three weekends exploring another set of *simple rules* from John Wesley – his "rules" for money. And, like his general rules for Christian living, John Wesley's rules for money are also pretty simple: 1) earn, 2) save, and 3) give. Of course, these rules are simply *stated*, but they are not always so simple to implement in our actual lives! I hope you will join us as we look to God for wisdom and guidance with the following themes for each week of this *Earn. Save. Give.* series:  
**October 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup>:** "Earn All You Can...Money – The Excellent Gift"  
**October 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup>:** "Save All You Can...You Can't Take It With You!"  
**October 22<sup>nd</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup>:** "Give All You Can...How Far Will You Go?"  
**October 29<sup>th</sup> & 30<sup>th</sup>:** Consecration Weekend

Pastor Mark and I are looking forward to diving into this sermon series together with you; I'll be preaching weeks 1 and 3, Pastor Mark will preach week 2, and **we'll be blessed to have Pastor Mike Flowers from the Spirit Lake Ministry Center as a guest preacher on Consecration Weekend.**

It is never easy to think and talk about money. It always feels so very personal...it is so very personal. But, like any relationship, our relationship with money can be healthy or unhealthy. My sincere hope for this stewardship series is that it will be both practical and inspiring – that where we need challenge, we'll be challenged and that where we need grace, we'll receive grace.

Money certainly is a "most excellent gift." During this series, may God open our hearts and minds to better understand the blessing money is and can be...and, during this series, may we become ever more aware of the ways in which money can be used as a tool of blessing in God's glorious kingdom.

## I've been thinking about this concept of BOTH / AND recently...

As I've been thinking about the ministry of Jesus, I see a ministry that was all about breaking down barriers AND creating new opportunities. Jesus wanted to welcome and include the sinners AND the saints. He wanted to welcome and include the Pharisees AND the Gentiles.

Consider Nicodemus. He sat on the highest religious court interpreting and handing down judgment based on religious belief and law. Yet Jesus received Nicodemus at night (see John 3). Jesus met Nicodemus on Nicodemus' terms so they could have the most important faith discussion Nicodemus ever had. Jesus met the woman at the well. It was an awkward time in an awkward place and he was meeting with someone everybody else had judged and condemned to be ostracized. Jesus ate with the "sinners" while others passed judgment for doing so. Jesus spent time at the temple, teaching, with the most religious of the religious.

Jesus didn't separate people as worthy or not worthy of the Good News. Jesus broke down barriers. He welcomed the little children while his friends were trying to shoo them away.

Our faith isn't a faith of Either / Or. Our faith isn't for the experienced or the novice, for the rich or the poor, for the sick or the healthy, for those who've been here for years or for those not here yet. Our faith is a faith of BOTH / AND. Our faith is a faith for each AND every one of us.

I find a lot of freedom in trying to engage with people where they are. I find freedom knowing that we don't have to be the judge in Jesus' name. I find a lot of freedom knowing that God is calling me to Love God AND love the people God puts in front of me and around me.

I don't have to get hung up on the details in this area. It's not Love God or Love Neighbor. It's not Love God and Love some of our neighbors. It's BOTH / AND. It's Love God AND Love Neighbor. It's love God AND love the people who are here, and the people who aren't here yet.

While I am a work in progress, I find freedom AND peace knowing that God calls me to Love God AND Love Neighbor, and that we get to live this Greatest Commandment out together.

It is a joy and privilege to love and serve God with you, Neighbor!

## Charge Conference + All-Church Meeting: October 23 & December 6

Every year, United Methodist churches have what's called a "Charge Conference" meeting. This meeting is a yearly meeting during which some specific items of business are presented, discussed, and voted on by any member who wishes to attend. Per paragraph 247 of our United Methodist Book of Discipline (denominational "book of law and order"), Charge Conference is to present and/or vote on a small number of business items, including: pastoral compensation packages, candidates for ministry, reports from Volunteer in Mission teams, and a membership report. **Our Charge Conference will be combined with other area United Methodist churches and it will take place on Sunday, October 23, from 4-6 p.m., at Legacy United Methodist Church in Bismarck.** The items mentioned above will be prepared for vote at Charge Conference, which will be led by our District Superintendent, Kermit Culver. This combined Charge Conference will also be a time for us to hear about how God is working throughout our District and Conference, as well as to be inspired and equipped for the ministry possibilities God is offering us. Please plan to attend!

In addition to the business items mentioned above, Charge Conference meetings typically include the following: receiving of reports from pastors, staff, committees, and other ministry teams; presentation of and voting on the annual General Fund budget; and the presentation of and voting on the Lay Leadership ("nominations") roster. **Because of the early timing of this year's Charge Conference, we will present and vote on these items during an All-Church Meeting on Tuesday, December 6, 6:30 p.m., in McCabe's Great Hall.** Waiting to present and vote on these items will afford us opportunity to be more faithful, particularly in preparing our budget.

We will not be receiving 2017 Estimates of Giving until *after* the October 23 Charge Conference and we are choosing to wait to fully prepare the budget until we have received those. With that in mind, we'll be able to look more fully at our mission and ministry by placing our pastoral / staff / committee reports together with the budget and Lay Leadership (nominations) report. We hope you will also plan to attend this December 6<sup>th</sup> meeting!

This two-meeting plan is a deviation from the norm as far as Charge Conference goes, but this is an earlier Charge Conference than we've had before! Please pray God's guidance upon us, upon our staff, and upon our whole church as we prepare for these important meetings. If you have any questions about any of this, do not hesitate to ask.

### **Great Adventures**



## Marin Ehrmantraut Volunteers for Mission Trip to Ecuador

It is with joy McCabe's Missions Team announces that Marin Ehrmantraut has volunteered for a United Methodist Volunteer-in-Mission trip to Ecuador over Christmas Break, December 27, 2016 through January 7, 2017! Marin is the daughter of our Pastor Mark & Brenda Ehrmantraut, and a junior at Bismarck Legacy High School.

A team of eight youth, young adults and two leaders from the North Central Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church will travel to Ecuador to engage in a relational mission with Ecuadorian youth, young adults, and their leaders. Marin will see God at work by engaging in some construction projects, Vacation Bible School, worship, study and play. In addition, Marin will discover her leadership capacity to serve through the church because all participants will be trained to be United Methodist Volunteer-in-Mission team leaders!!

With the spirit of mission at work in our hearts the Mission's team invites our McCabe congregation to join us in "Sending Marin Forth" in Christ's name on this life-changing Mission of Discover! Endorsed by Pastor Jenny's blessing, our *5th Sunday Offering for Mission* of undesignated gifts, a **noisy bucket offering** during worship services on **October 29-30**, will be designated for Marin's trip expenses!

### Trip Details:

The cost for each U.S. team member is \$2,700 (for airline tickets, lodging, food and transportation in Ecuador). Funds raised in excess of \$2,700 will help Marin with her team fund-raising efforts in support of her Ecuadorian teammates who do not have the means to raise their funds for trip lodging, food, and transportation, and for project supplies (construction and materials for events with Ecuadorian children).

The impact of relational missions like this is phenomenal. When youth and young adults from the U.S.A. can engage with those from another culture in Christian love, we can expect outcomes of understanding and acceptance between the cultures. ## Wholly Healthy

Greetings McCabe friends,

The beauty and splendor of fall is all around us from the rising harvest moon to the yellow, oranges and reds of the turning leaves. We all know that fall is also the season to remember our need to protect ourselves from the flu by receiving our flu shot. It is recommended that everyone 6 months and older receive the vaccine. A higher dose vaccine is recommended for those 65 and older. As we age, our immune system is not as responsive as it was when we were younger and it is believed that by providing the higher dose vaccine it helps support the immune system more effectively. Discuss this option with your personal physician to determine if this vaccine is best for you.

It takes about 2 weeks for protection to develop after the vaccination, and this protection lasts several months up to a year.

Some people should **not** get the flu vaccine. This would include those who have had a severe, life-threatening allergic reaction after a flu shot, severe allergy to eggs and anyone ever having Guillain-Barre Syndrome (a severe paralyzing illness).

The flu vaccine is readily available at local pharmacies, personal physician's offices and City/County Nursing services. Medicare and most insurances will cover the cost of the flu vaccination. The timing of receiving the vaccine is often questioned. Is it better to receive it early in the fall or later? There are varying opinions on this, but some physicians encourage us to wait until late October into early November so the vaccine continues to be active in the system into early spring when we usually see another rise in the incidence of the flu. Always remember, frequent handwashing with good old soap and water is one of our best defenses against contracting the flu.

This is also a good time to be discussing the need for the pneumonia vaccine. Prevnar13 is a newer vaccine that covers more types of pneumonia. It is now being recommended for those 65 and older. There are some time constraints regarding when the regular pneumonia shot (Pneumovax) was given and when the Prevnar13 can be given. Discuss this with your personal physician for the appropriate recommendation for you.

My storage closets are overflowing with wonderful adaptive devices to be borrowed in time of need. I have an abundance of walkers (both standard and seated walkers), shower chairs/benches, raised toilet seats, crutches, and other equipment ready to be used. This equipment is in good working condition and was so generously donated by church members. Please give me a call if you find yourself in need of adaptive equipment and I will assist you in finding what you may need.

## 1st Street Parsonage: SOLD!

Through coordinated work with our Leadership Team and Trustees, a recommendation was made to McCabe that we consider **selling the property on 1st Street in Bismarck** that had long served as one of our church-owned parsonages. In April, we had a special Charge Conference meeting with over 40 McCabe members in attendance. At that meeting, the majority of persons present voted to approve the recommendation to sell that property.

In mid-August, the house closed and we received payment. Per denominational and Dakotas Conference rules, the proceeds from church property sales can only be spent on *capital expenses*. After all sale-related costs are factored in, **we have approximately \$255,690 from this sale; with this money in hand, we are now beginning the process of discerning how to spend that money in the best, most faithful way(s) possible.**

Our Leadership Team, Board of Trustees and Finance Committee are working together to make these important decision. *Please pray for God's guidance as we seek to be good stewards of this money.*



## October ONE Thing: Christmas Shoe Boxes

Time goes by so quickly but it is time to begin to collect items for our shoe boxes now so that they are ready for **pickup November 17th** and distribution early in December. If you are unfamiliar with this program, simply put, this shoe box may very well be the only gift that the children of the Spirit Lake Reservation receive. There are about 4,000 children and each year the churches of North and South Dakota answer the need. This is the 12th year that McCabe has participated and with each year the number of boxes we donate increases. Let's keep us that good pace. **2015 brought 304 which was only 2 short of our all time record!**

This is our **ONE Thing** here at McCabe for October and to the middle of November. If you need a box, take one and fill it. There are some wrapped boxes available for your use, so pick up one or ten...fill them and return them.

This is a simple project. Wrap a shoebox, top and bottom separately, and then fill them with whatever you think a child of the age you pick will like. Put a rubber band around the box and mark it with a gift tag indicating the age and gender and bring it to the church. Because of the difficulty in matching sizes only hats, mittens and scarves should be put into the boxes.

The following are the age groups and suggestions as to items to be given:

**Infants - 2 years:** baby powder, bibs, blankets, bottles, infant toys, soft books.

**Girls 3-5 & 6-8:** age appropriate educational items, reading books, dolls, stuffed animals, crayons, water-color paints or markers, games, puzzles, hair accessories, hats, mittens, gloves, scarves.

**Boys 3-5 & 6-8:** age appropriate educational items, cars, trucks, coloring/painting books, watercolors, markers, construction toys, Legos, reading books, games, puzzles, card games, hats, scarves, gloves, mittens.

**Older Girls 9-11 & 12-14:** purses, makeup, nail polish, hair accessories, hair products, perfume, games, puzzles, reading books, hats, gloves, mittens, scarves.

**Girls 15 & up:** same items as the girls ages 12-14, just a little more grown up.

**Older Boys 9-11 & 12-14:** electronic handheld games, cards games, watches, flashlights, reading books, hats, mittens, gloves.

**Boys 15 & up:** same items as the boys ages 12-14, just a little more grown up.

**All items and/or boxes need to be brought to the church no later than Sunday, November 13.** This is a project of the Dakotas Conference and is run by Mike & Libby Flowers who are missionaries to the Spirit Lake Reservation.


